We're excited to announce that Megan Jendrick is Fife's new assistant city manager. Jendrick continues to head the parks department, and now has the joint title of Assistant City Manager / Parks, Recreation, and Aquatics Director. Her additional duties will include acting as city manager when Fife City Manager Derek Matheson is away, chairing the Operational Leadership Team, working on special projects, developing a citywide strategic plan, and advising Matheson on citywide issues.

Jendrick initially joined the city in 2013 as an aquatics coordinator, after retiring from a career as a professional athlete and author. In 2016, she became the aquatics services director, before later being promoted to the parks, recreation, and aquatics director position in 2017. Jendrick has a bachelors in health sciences from Arizona State University, and a Master of Public Administration (Leadership) from the University of Texas. She is a member of the International City/County Management Association and is a graduate of its High Performance Leadership Academy.

May 1-31

Asian American, Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander (AANHPI) Heritage Month is observed annually in May. During this month, we recognize the history and achievements of Asian Americans, Native Hawaiians, and Pacific Islanders who make our country more vibrant through diversity of cultures, languages and religions.

May 14-20

During **National Police Week** we honor the Fife Police Department, which plays an essential role in protecting Fife's citizens. As part of this week, we also remember those who gave their lives in service to their community on **Peace Officers Memorial Day**, May 15. Mayor Kim Roscoe will issue a proclamation recognizing both of these observances during the May 9 regular city council meeting. Fife is grateful for the fantastic work our law enforcement officers and the police department support staff do to keep us safe.



May 21-27

National Public Works Week will be recognized with a proclamation at the May 23 council meeting.

Thanks to our public works crew and support staff for everything they do to keep our city running!

Fife's public works professionals maintain 44 lane miles of roadway and 41 miles of sidewalks; 85 miles of water mains, 41 miles of sewer pipes, 30 miles of storm-drain pipes and 2,054 catch basins; provide 728 million gallons of clean drinking water, pump 193 million gallons of sewage for treatment and clean 811 manholes.

It's **Memorial Day**, when our nation pauses to remember all those who died while serving in the U.S. military. Please note that all city buildings will be closed for the holiday.
